- 2. Resident of the Greater Bay Area, which includes Monterey, and the area up to the border of Sacramento.
- 3. Has reached high goals in his/her field of endeavor.
- 4. Has made a significant achievement in a professional, academic, or scientific field or in the humanities.
- 5. Has made a contribution to the Hellenic community or to society in general.

As you will find in their brief biographies, both of these recipients meet and exceed these criteria. We congratulate them all, and thank them for their many years of service and dedication to their community.

## MARIA MAVROUDI, PH.D.

Maria Mavroudi is a distinguished scholar and innovative leader studying Byzantium and its interplay with the Arab world. She was born in Thessaloniki, Greece, and earned a B. A. in Philology from the University of Thessaloniki in 1990. She went on to receive her M.A. and Ph.D. in Byzantine Studies from Harvard University in 1998. She is professor of history and classics at the University of California Berkeley. She has written numerous books, scholarly articles, and reviews on topics ranging from the occult sciences in Byzantium, bilingualism in Greek and Arabic, dream

interpretation in Byzantium, translations of classical texts, and the transformation of Byzantine culture after 1453. Dr. Mavroudi has received numerous fellowships funding her studies, including the prestigious MacArthur Foundation "Genius" award in 2004. She is making substantive contributions to the preservation and presentation of Hellenic Culture, literature, and Orthodoxy.

#### Marina Velliou Moustakas

Marina Moustakas is a pioneering leader of the Greek community working for the preservation and dissemination of Greek culture. She was born in Kozani, Greece, and grew up in Athens. She received a degree in Social Work from Greece, as a recipient of a Greek National Scholarship (IKY), and a B.A. and graduate studies in sociology from the University of Oregon with a Fulbright Scholarship. She founded and directed the St. Nicholas Hellenic School for 15 years and has taught Greek language since 1962. Marina co-founded the Greek Festival of San Jose and served as a case worker

for the UN High Commissioner and the US Welfare Department. She served as Director of Human Resources at Montessori School, produced a Greek TV show, and founded and directed the youth dance groups of St. Nicholas. Marina writes poetry and is working on an autobiography. Marina is the Founder and President of the Hellenic Heritage Institute in San Jose, a beacon of Hellenism to the West. Marina is a leader who works tirelessly for the preservation of Hellenism.
